# FUTURE CONTINUOUS

## ZACZNIJMY OD KONSTRUKCJI:

### zdanie oznajmujące:

will + be + czasownik z -ing

przykład:

- I will be watching TV tonight at 19:00.
- He will be working tomorrow at 11:00.

### przeczenie

tworzemy przez dodanie 'not' do operatora 'will'

przykład:

- I will not be watching TV tonight at 19:00.  
(won't be watching)
- He will not be working tomorrow at 11:00.  
(won't be working)

### pytanie

tworzemy przez przestawienie operatora 'will'  
przed podmiot:

przykład:

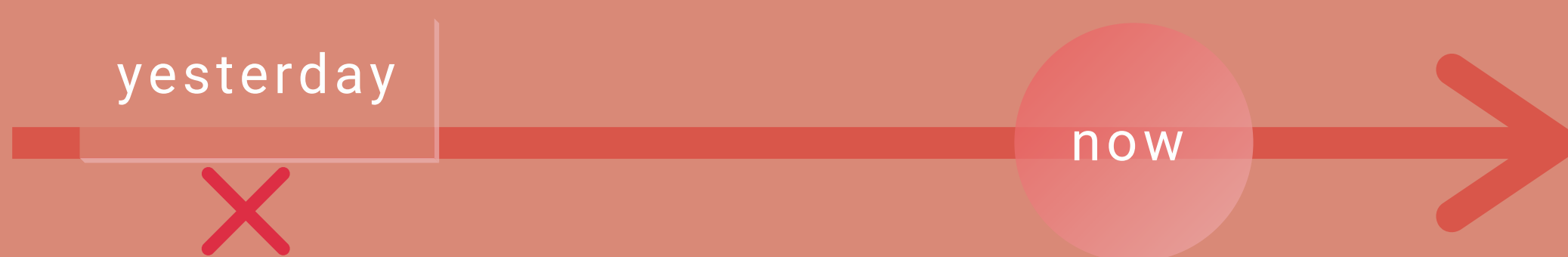
- Will you be watching TV tonight at 19:00?
- Will he be working tomorrow at 11:00?

Yes, he will. / No, he won't.

# FUTURE CONTINUOUS

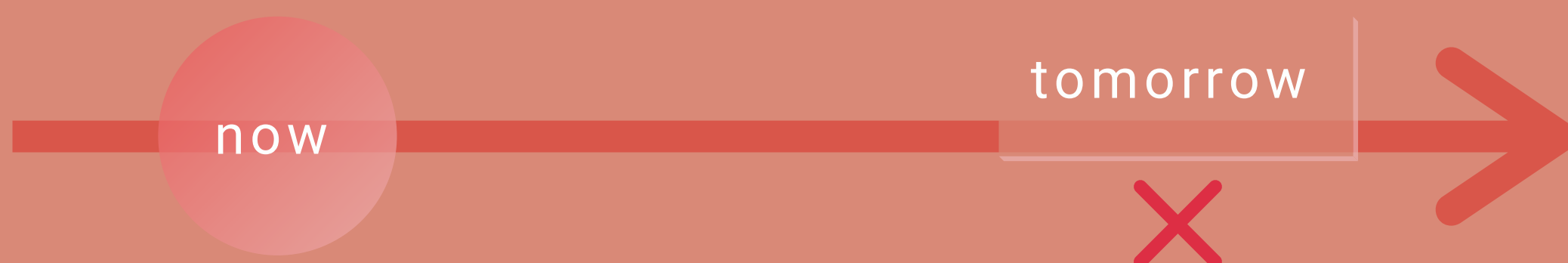
SAMA NAZWA MÓWI NAM TAK NAPRAWDĘ  
WSZYSTKO O UŻYCIU :-)

MOŻE WAM TEŻ POMÓC PODOBIENSTWO  
DO PAST CONTINUOUS



Yesterday at this time we were dancing at the wedding.

W FUTURIE CONTINUOUS PRZENOSIMY TO  
NA PRZYSZŁOŚĆ



Tomorrow at this time we will be dancing at the wedding.

# FUTURE CONTINUOUS

Używamy:



**DO WYRAŻANIA CZYNNOŚCI TYMCZASOWYCH,  
KTÓRE BĘDĄ W TRAKCIE W DANYM MOMENCIE  
W PRZYSZŁOŚCI**

Przykłady:

- This time next week, I'll be taking photographs with my new camera.
- Next week they will be flying to Australia from Saudi Arabia.
- She will not be working on Tuesday.



**CZASOWNIK JEST NIEDOKONANY!**

Czyli:

- będę robić zdjęcia (nie - zrobię)
- będą lecieć (nie - polecą)
- będę tańczyć (nie - zatańczę)
- będziemy oglądać (nie - obejrzą)



# FUTURE PERFECT

A KIEDY GO UŻYWAMY?

*DO WESELA SIĘ ZAGOI.*

To typowe zdanie właśnie w tym czasie.

On tylko tak wygląda groźnie, a w rzeczywistości ma bardzo konkretne użycie.



**DO WSKAZANEGO MOMENTU W PRZYSZŁOŚCI  
COŚ ZOSTANIE ZAKOŃCZONE**

Przykłady:

- Do you think she'll have seen the doctor by four o'clock?
- Next month my parents will have been together for thirty years.
- At the end of this month, they will have been in their house for one year.
- Next month I will have worked for the company for six years.
- I think they'll have got there by six o'clock.

# FUTURE PERFECT

## PORÓWNAJMY GO Z INNYMI PERFEKCYJNYMI

Present Perfect:

They have been married for 10 years.

Future Perfect:

Next year they will have been married for 10 years.

Past Perfect:

When their son was born, they had been married for 10 years.

# FUTURE CONTINUOUS /PERFECT

## ZERKNIJ NA TAKĄ HISTORIĘ:

*Kevin loves football and this evening there is a big football match on television. The match begins at 7.30 and ends at 9.15. Paul wants to see Kevin the same evening and wants to know what time to come to his house.*

PAUL: Is it all right if I come at about 8.30?

KEVIN: No, I'll **be watching** the football then.

PAUL: Well, what about 9.30?

KEVIN: Fine. The match **will have finished** by then.



**I WILL BE DOING SOMETHING = I WILL BE  
IN THE MIDDLE OF DOING SOMETHING**

The football match begins at 7.30 and ends at 9.15. So during this time, for example at 8.30, Kevin **will be watching the match**.

Inny przykład:

I'm going on holiday on Saturday.

This time next week I'll **be lying** on a beach or **swimming** in the sea



# FUTURE CONTINUOUS /PERFECT

## PONOWNIE ZERKNIJ NA TĘ ROZMOWĘ:

*Kevin loves football and this evening there is a big football match on television. The match begins at 7.30 and ends at 9.15. Paul wants to see Kevin the same evening and wants to know what time to come to his house.*

PAUL: Is it all right if I come at about 8.30?

KEVIN: No, I'll **be watching** the football then.

PAUL: Well, what about 9.30?

KEVIN: Fine. The match **will have finished** by then.



**WILL HAVE DONE = SOMETHING WILL  
ALREADY BE COMPLETE**

Kevin's football match ends at 9.15. So after this time, for example at 9.30, the match **will have finished**.

Inny przykłady:

- Sally always leaves for work at 8.30 in the morning, so she won't be at home at 9 o'clock. She'll have gone to work.
- We're late. The film will already have started by the time we get to the cinema.

# FUTURE CONTINUOUS/ SIMPLE

## PORÓWNAJ:

- Don't phone me between 7 and 8. We'll be having dinner then.
- Let's wait for Mary to arrive and then we'll have dinner.

## RÓŻNICA JEST TAKA, ŻE:



**FS MÓWI O CZYMŚ KRÓTKIM, A FC O CZYMŚ,  
CO BĘDZIE TRWAŁO**



**MOŻE BYĆ TEŻ TAK, ŻE DŁUGĄ CZYNNOŚĆ W  
PRZYSZŁOŚCI (FC) PRZERWIE KRÓTKA  
CZYNNOŚĆ (FS)**

- The plane will land when we will be waiting at the airport.
- I will be watching TV and you will make coffee.
