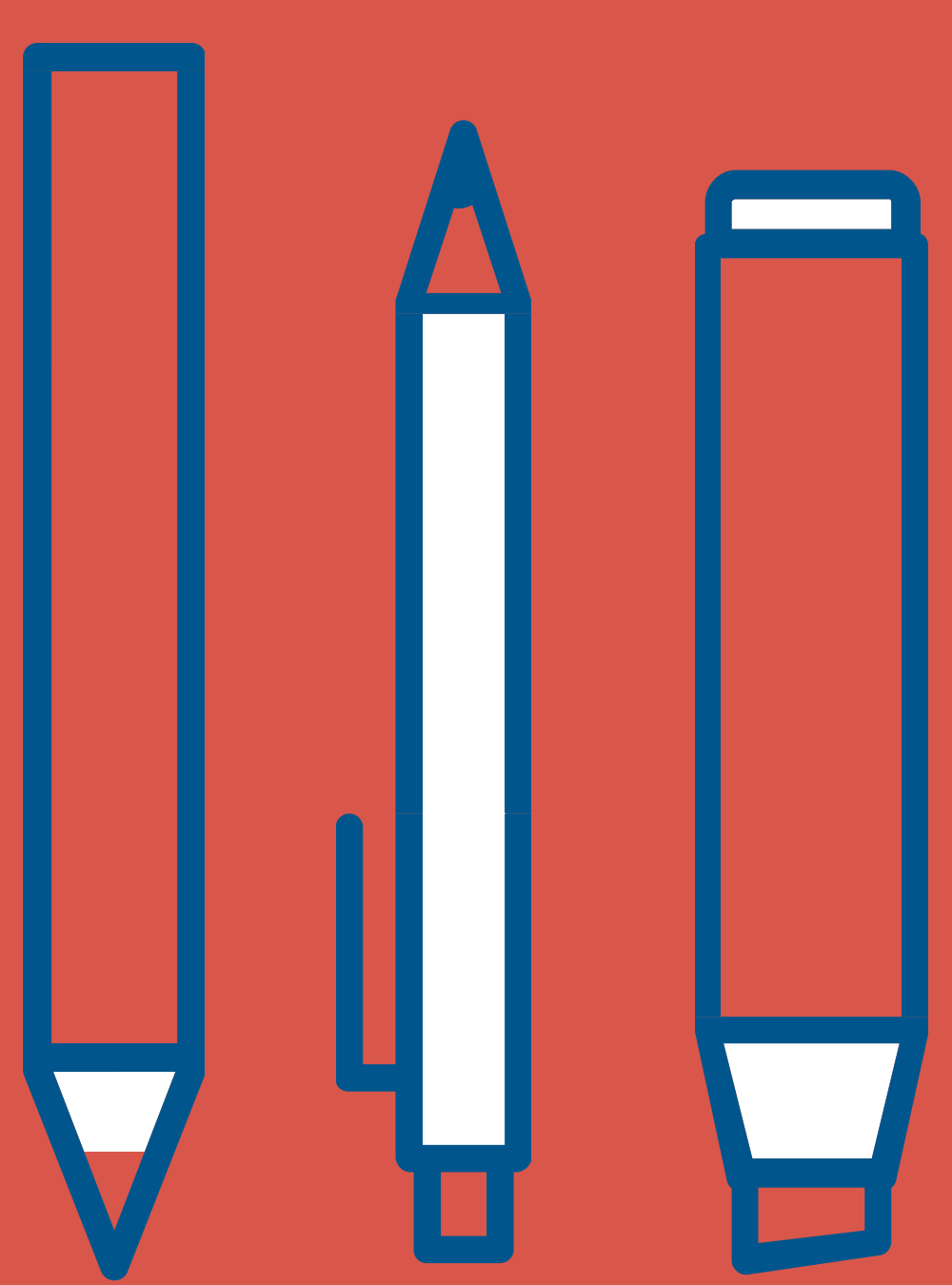

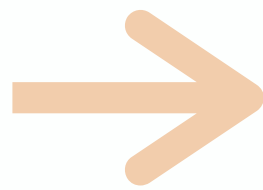

CONDITIONALS

Co to są tak w ogóle te *conditionale*?



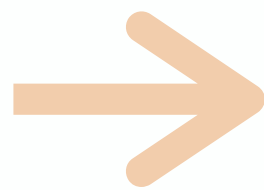
WARUNEK



REZULTAT



IF...



ZDANIE GŁÓWNE

Przykład:

- If you owe money, you must pay it back immediately.
- If a lot of people come, we'll have to get extra chairs.
- If I had money, I would buy a car.

Kolejność zdań może być zamieniona:

- I'll go to Bristol tomorrow if the weather is good. (no coma)

Kilka faktów:

- Zdania warunkowe uwzględniają wyobrażone lub niepewne sytuacje i możliwe skutki tych sytuacji.
- Istnieją różne rodzaje warunków.
- Niektóre są możliwe lub prawdopodobne, inne mało prawdopodobne, a inne niemożliwe.
- Używamy szeregu wyrażen, aby mówić o warunkach.

3RD CONDITIONAL

Pamiętacie drugi okres warunkowy -

Gdyby babcia miała wąsy, to by była dziadkiem



WARUNEK MAŁO MOŻLIWY LUB
ZUPEŁNIE NIEMOŻLIWY DO SPEŁNIENIA
W TERAŹNIEJSZOŚCI LUB PRZYSZŁOŚCI

Trzeci jest bardzo podobny.

Jedyna różnica to czas - tu mówimy o przeszłości.



A SKORRO TO PRZESZŁOŚĆ TO
OCZYWISTE, ŻE WARUNEK JEST
NIEMOŻLIWY DO SPEŁNIENIA

Przykład:

- If I **had played** better, I **would have won**. (I didn't play well and I didn't win.)
- It **would have been** easier if George **had brought** his own car. (George didn't bring his own car, so the situation was difficult.)
- If the dog **hadn't barked**, we **wouldn't have known** there was someone in the garden. (The dog barked, so we knew there was someone in the garden.)

3RD CONDITIONAL

Jaka tworzymy ten okres warunkowy?

IF + PAST PERFECT

WOULD HAVE + III FORMA

Przykład:

- If we John **had told** me about his problems, I **would have tried** to help him.
- If he **had stayed** in the same room as Dave, it **would have been** a disaster.

Oczywiście kolejność można zamienić:

- She **wouldn't have been** tired if she **had gone** to bed earlier.
- She **would have become** a teacher if she **had gone** to university.
- He **would have been** on time for the interview if he **had left** the house at nine

3RD CONDITIONAL

Czy może być coś zamiast Past Perfect lub would?
Oczywiście!

IF + PAST PERFECT
CONTINUOUS

COULD / SHOULD / MIGHT
HAVE + III FORMA

Past Perfect Continuous używamy:



GDY WARUNEK ODNOSI SIĘ DO
HIPOTETYCZNEJ CZYNNOŚCI TRWAJĄCEJ
W DANEJ CHWILI W PRZESZŁOŚCI

Przykład:

- If the boy **hadn't been jumping**, he **wouldn't have broken** his leg.
- If the driver **had been wearing** a seat belt, he **would probably have survived** the accident.
- If I **had been living** in New York at the time, I **would have gone** to the show.
- If I **hadn't been working** all day, I **would have gone** jogging.

3RD CONDITIONAL

Kiedy zamiast would inne modalne?



DLA WYRAŻENIA PRZYPUSZCZENIA,
POZWOLENIA, ZDOLNOŚCI LUB MOŻLIWOŚCI

Przykład:

- I **could have finished** the report on time if my boss had asked for it earlier. (ability)
- If I had had the right tools, I **could have fixed** my bike. (ability)
- If the weather had been worse, they **might not have reached** the top. (possibility)

Można też wyrazić ciągłość w zdaniu głównym:

IF + PAST PERFECT

WOULD + HAVE BEEN +
CZASOWNIK + ING

Przykład:

- Mark and Jenny **wouldn't have been quarreling** if his ex-girlfriend hadn't texted him.
- If the weather had been better, I'd **have been sitting** in the garden when he arrived.
- If she hadn't got a job in London, she **would have been working** in Paris
- .If I had had a ball I **would have been playing** football.
- If I had known it was dangerous I **wouldn't have been climbing** that cliff.

3RD CONDITIONAL

Jeszcze chciałabym dodać informację o użyciu **can** po **if**:



**DLA WYRAŻENIA UMIEJETNOŚCI,
MOŻLIWOŚCI LUB POZWOLENIA**

W 2 okresie warunkowym:

- I'd go to the beach with you if I **could** swim. (ability)
- If you **could** be a famous person, who would you be? (possibility)
- I wouldn't go to bars if people **could** smoke inside. (permission)

w 3 okresie warunkowym:

- If he **could have got** to the station on time, he might have caught the train. (ability)
- If I **could have known** this would happen, I'd never have started dating him. (possibility)

2ND AND 3RD CONDITIONAL

Let's compare the 2nd 3rd Conditionals

2nd Conditional

condition is impossible
or imaginary in future
and present

I'm not hungry.

If I **was** hungry, I **would eat**
eat something.

3rd Conditional

condition is impossible
in past

I wasn't hungry.

If I **had been** hungry, I **would**
have eaten something.

If he **invited** me, I **would go**
to his party (unlikely but
still possible).

If he **had invited** me, I **would**
have gone to his party (in
the past – impossible).

3RD CONDITIONAL
